EDUCATION & TRAINING FOUNDATION

T Level Resource Improvement Projects (TRIPs) are an opportunity for providers to produce resources that will support the planning and delivery of T Levels.

Previous TRIPs

In 2023/24 there were 14 TRIP projects. All projects have produced high-quality resources, that focus on scaffolding learning. These resources were produced to share with the sector.

The resources are T Level specific and include lesson plans, student activities, case studies and formative assessments.

These resources are available on the **ETF TLPD** website.

TRIPs 2024/25

24 TRIPS to be commissioned – commencing in November 2024 and completing by May 2025.

TRIPS are commissioned against a specific brief and a specific T Level; in all cases the focus is on applied learning and developing higher order thinking skills.

The scope of TRIP briefs has increased to encompass SEND and T Level Foundation Year.

TRIP briefs 2024/25 support:

- delivery of core knowledge content
- development of contextualised core skills
- formative assessment of core knowledge content
- holistic delivery of core content and occupational specialism content
- delivery of T Level Foundation Year
- SEND learners.

Expectations of successful applicants

- Attendance at two sessions before TRIP starts one online, one F2F.
- Four F2F on-site workshops to draft, review and complete outputs.
- Working to a project plan with specific milestone dates.
- Rigorous quality assurance process.
- Use of TEAMS for communication and uploading of outputs.
- Use of specific templates to ensure high quality, accessible outcomes.

- Resource Producers responsible for creating the resources.
- 2. Resource Advisors provide guidance and curriculum expertise to shape the initial scope of the TRIP and review and pilot the resources at regular intervals as they are produced.

Application and funding

Each TRIP will require one resource producer who will be funded £10,000 to produce the agreed outputs.

Wherever possible each TRIP will be supported by a resource advisor. Resource advisors are funded **up to** £3,000.

When applying to be a resource producer, providers need to apply for a specific brief and a specific T Level.

Resource advisors only apply for a specific T Level route.

Providers can apply for more than one TRIP.

- Plan your time to create the resources, make sure that you give it 100%.
- Work with a colleague and keep in regular contact with your AoC TRIP Lead.
- Familiarise yourself with the format at the start.
- Stay adaptable and open to feedback as this will help you refine your approach and create a more effective T Level course.
- Ensure you and anyone else working on the resources are aware of the deadlines.
